The SMSF Association welcomes the opportunity to make a submission on the Financial Adviser Standards and Ethics Authority's (FASEA) Provisional Relevant Provider Term Legislative Instrument.

We have no issues with the term 'Provisional Financial Adviser' or 'Provisional Financial Planner' being used to refer to a Provisional Relevant Provider.

Both terms are interchangeable and adequately clear enough to describe that the relevant provider is undergoing a training year.

The SMSF Association believes there is scope for FASEA to provide a more specified pathway for limited licence financial advisers (this will be reflected in our other submissions). In the event that FASEA tailors some of its standards for the limited license framework, it may be appropriate to introduce a term which acknowledges a provisional limited financial adviser.
